Lemon Report

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We believe that bad moments don't make for a bad day. However, this report gives students a chance to reflect on their behavior by answering questions that help them turn lemons into lemonade just in case we run into a similar situation again. This report is in addition to the incident/mood report that will be sent to parents on the ProCare app.



Sweetner Plan

My grandma always used to say, "come here and give grandma some sugar" which often meant a big hug and wet kiss on the cheek was coming my way. This plan is for students who need just a little bit more sugar. Students who are on the autism spectrum or have diverse cognitive abilities are encouraged to ask about this plan.

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How will you communicate with parents?

We utilize the procare app (download is required) to send text messages, emails, incident/mood reports. We also create a facebook group for registered parents.

Will my child be grouped with the older kids (vice-versa)?

Within our educational rotations students will be grouped 1st-2nd, 3rd-5th, and 6th-8th. Students will come together for meals, and some recreational activities.

Can parents volunteer?

Yes, we specifically need more volunteers for Fun Friday Activities. All volunteers must complete a background check. Email info@blacklemonade.org for more information.

What is your student to teacher ratio?

We have a minimum ratio of 1 to 10 and a maximum of 1 to 15 dependent on age/grade.

How do you respond to student behavior?

At the beginning of the day we shine light on students who who made a positive impact on the day prior. Students will be recognized in front of their peers and have a chance to select a prize from our Lemonade Locker.

Prior to camp, staff take professional development courses to ensure we are educated and equipped to handle diverse situations. Trainings include, but are not limited to: Social and Emotional Learning, Behavior Management, Autism and Cognitive Disorders, DE&I, Leadership...etc.

Ask about our lemon reports and sweetener plans!

We also work with parents in developing and implementing plans that work at home.

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My student is going to Kindergarten in the fall of 2025, can l register them for this camp?

Unfortunately, due to the nature of this camp, we currently do not accept students who have not completed kindergarten

I am registering two or more students who are not siblings, am eligible for the sibling discount?

Students who live in the same household and have the same guardian(s) are eligible for the sibling discount. If they are related by blood, but not siblings, we will honor up to one sibling discount. Additional terms and conditions apply.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available and limited. Those who are granted a scholarship can not combine any other offer or discounts with their offer.

Bathroom Breaks

Bathroom passes are given and students must hang them on the entry door to the bathroom prior to entering. Students who see this on the door may not enter unless there is an adult supervising the bathroom area. Adults use a separate bathroom

Can my student bring their breakfast/lunch?

Black Lemonade partners with organizations who provide meals per the Federal Food Service Program. Students are welcome to bring their lunch and store it in the onsite refrigerator and use the onsite microwave. Black Lemonade is not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

What should I send my student to camp with?

A positive attitude, closed toed shoes, and a reusable water bottle with their name on it.



What not to bring to camp

Large backpacks (unless it is Fun Friday), no electronic devices, medications (exceptions: inhalers and epipens), valuables, weapons or sharp objects, opentoed shoes, cash (except on field trip days).
